### REFLECTIVE PRAYER RESOURCE FOR LENT

In this Jubilee Year, you are invited to spend some time this Lent reflecting on the words of the Jubilee Prayer.

Each week, a recorded reflection will help you to think, consider and pray a different part of the prayer.

This time of reflection can be used individually, perhaps as you travel to work or journey in the car, or with a lit candle in your room.

The accompanying booklet means you could also use it as a family or a small group in the parish, to pray together and think about the different themes and intentions found in the prayer.

### **FUNERAL MINISTRY PRAYER LEADERS**

This is an important and growing ministry in many parishes as we look to accompany bereaved families. Funeral Ministry Prayer Leaders are members of parish Funeral Ministry Teams. They can lead a variety of prayer moments with the families in the lead up to the funeral, they can lead Funeral Services (that aren't Mass) and also the Rite of Committal at the grave or crematorium.

The next round of training is taking place in St Paul's in March. Places are limited and a number of people have already registered.

On 12th February 121 members of Baptism Teams from across the diocese came to St Paul's to explore and experience the new Baptism Preparation Process for parishes in the diocese.

This video based resource enables Baptism Teams to accompany parents in line with our Accompanying Families Sacramental Policy. Designed to be one meeting with parents, the process is divided into a number of moments for guided reflection, conversation and simple activities to do at home.


Lastly, save the date of April 27th for the Canonisation of Carlo Acutis... more details to follow!






